

Brain Injury Specialty Program



2025 Outcomes

ADULT

- 165 patients were served, ages 19-86 (with an average age of 49 years).
- 37% were female and 63% were male.
- 84% of patients were White, 12% were Black, 1% Hispanic, 1% Asian & 1% Pacific Islander
- 86% of long-term goals were achieved during their program.
- 100% of those surveyed live at home 90 days after their program.
- 14% reported going back to work when reached for 1-year follow-up.
- 33 patients were referred to our Return-To-Work program.
- Patients spent 19 hrs. in physical therapy, 17.4 hrs. in occupational therapy & 19 hrs. in speech therapy, on average.
- Only 4% of patients had an unplanned readmission to the hospital during their program (compared to the national average of 15%).
- 100% of patients reached said they returned to their hobbies and spent time socially with friends at 90-day follow-up; 100% at 1-year follow-up.
- No patients reached for 90-day follow-up reported having fallen without injury. (goal is <25%). None reported having fallen with an injury (goal is <15%).
- 90% of patients reported being better able to care for their daily needs at 90-day follow-up; 80% at one-year follow-up.
- 100% of patients reached reported making regular visits to their doctor at 90-day follow-up; 100% at one-year follow-up.
- 100% of patients reached for 90-day follow-up reported feeling like they were adjusting to life since their brain injury; 100% at one-year follow-up.
- 100% surveyed felt involved in planning their treatment plan and goals.
- 100% of patients surveyed were satisfied with the outcomes they achieved.

PEDIATRIC & ADOLESCENTS

- 74 patients served, ages 3-18 (with an average age of 11.3 years).
- 51% were female and 49% were male.
- 62% of patients were White, 30% Black, 5% Hispanic & 3% Asian/Pacific Islander
- 90% of long-term goals were achieved.
- Patients spent 18.4 hours in physical therapy, 17.9 hours in occupational therapy and 31.8 hrs. in speech therapy, on average.
- 100% lived at home after their program.
- 100% of eligible patients transitioned back to school.
- 100% of parents reached said their child played with children their age or spent time with friends at 90 days and 1-year follow-up.
- Only 1.4% of patients had unplanned readmission to the hospital during their program (compared to the national average of 15%).
- 100% of parents surveyed feel their child has adjusted to life after their injury.
- 100% surveyed were satisfied with their outcomes.
